Student Spotlight: Marcus Solomon, Morgan



Marcus Solomon, along with 57 other students who have completed their high school credits since mid-August, is a proud member of the Foothills class of 2018. Marcus transferred to Foothills during his junior year of high school from Morgan County Schools. Since transferring in January of 2017, Marcus has completed his graduation requirements—one semester before his grade and age-level peers! Marcus also holds the honor of being the first dual enrollment student at our Morgan Foothills site.

Marcus enrolled in Foothills so that he could graduate early, while also continuing to work and attend school simultaneously. Foothills was the right option for Marcus for several reasons. In addition to having flexibility in his schedule to work and attend school, Marcus enjoyed being able to work at his own pace. Foothills' unique structure allowed Marcus to move faster through courses he was "good at," but take more time in the courses where he experienced difficulty. Marcus shared that he had the time and opportunity to get more one-on-one time from teachers, and had access to extra support in math courses. This is not something that he was able to access in the traditional high school setting.

As a new high school graduate, Marcus has recently taken the SAT, and he plans to continue his learning at the postsecondary level.

AdvanceD Accreditation Visit: A Continuous Improvement Process

Between February 25 and February 28, Foothills will host an AdvancED Engagement Review Team. AdvancED is a non-partisan, non-profit organization that conducts rigorous external reviews of education institutions around the world. The external team of educators that will visit Foothills in late February will talk with staff and other stakeholders, review documents, and observe classrooms. They will provide feedback to Foothills' leadership and the governing board that will guide our continuous improvement efforts, and ultimately, they will make a recommendation regarding whether or not Foothills should be accredited. AdvancED states that their goal isn't to decide if Foothills is "good enough"; rather, they are committed to helping us "continuously improve" (http://www.advanc-ed.org/about-us).

The process of accreditation does not begin with the visiting team in February. Foothills leadership and staff have been working to prepare for the external visit for many months. A small leadership team is spearheading the work, and stakeholders (from the governance board to community partners) have been asked to provide input and feedback via surveys.

As we move into January, we will use stakeholder feedback to finalize self-ratings on a variety of "system quality factors," such as clear direction, high expectations, and resource management. In addition, we will be gathering artifacts and evidence that demonstrate Foothills' commitment to and implementation of these quality factors.

Because of the unique structure of Foothills, our processes and evidence do not always fit the AdvancED framework or quality factors the same way that they would for a traditional high school. Yet, we have been pleased to find throughout this self-assessment process that our work at Foothills is "quality" work, and we are excited to share the work of Foothills with our visiting team.
